On Wednesday of this week, a young son of Samuel Wertz of Lewisburg was killed over by a mule, which inflicted a dreadful gash on one cheek bone. The wound is not considered dangerous.

We think this clearly a mistake, as all persons actually living in their place on the 1st June are to be counted. This omission will reduce the actual number about 200 in those two districts.

The Lincoln party in Juniata county have nominated Col. John J. Patterson for the Assembly.

The August Elections.

North Carolina leads off the State elections for this year, on Thursday August 2d, when a Governor is to be chosen. John W. Ellis, the present incumbent, is the Democratic candidate, and John Pool the Opposition.

On Monday, August 6, Arkansas, Kentucky, and Missouri will follow. Arkansas elects Governor and Congressmen; Johnson is the Democratic candidate for the former position, and Rector is an independent democratic candidate.

Kentucky elects but one State officer, the Clerk of the Court of Appeals, Leslie Combs, (Union.) Clinton McClary, (Breckinridge.) R. R. Bolling and Brent Hopkins (Ind.) are the candidates.

Missouri will choose Governor, State officers, and Congressmen. Four candidates for Governor are in the field.

The Republicans will make a show in Missouri only. In the other States, they will go with the Bell or Douglas men.

LEBANON, July 31, 1890--Yesterday, the People's County Convention met here, and by a unanimous vote endorsed Mr. Kitting's official course and placed him in nomination for re-election to Congress.

The conferees chosen are Joseph Reinhard, Andrew Henry, and John H. Kintport. They have recommended Georgetown as the place, and Friday, August 2d, at 2 o'clock, P. M., as the time of meeting the delegates from the other counties.

It is to be hoped the arrangement will meet the convenience of the gentlemen yet to be designated by Union and Snyder counties.

Primm, Mrs. Janssall, and Miss Lewis Bohand went over the Black River Falls at this place this afternoon. All the party were drowned, and the body of one of the ladies can be seen hanging upon a rock below the Falls. Efforts are being made to reach it.
