It is said if you cut bushes in the old of the moon in August, you will destroy them root and branch. We do not believe the moon will interfere in the matter, but believe August is cause, vegetation having come to a close for the season, the bushes will not so readily sprout again from the roots.

From the middle of August to the middle of September, is said to be the best time for sowing winter rye. By sowing early, you provide green food for sheep late in the fall and early in the spring, and by early sowing in the fall or last of summer, the roots of the grain take such firm and extensive hold of the soil that they will be less time to likely to be winter-killed.

In your garden, you will continue to gather the best specimens of seeds to propagate from, and will be careful not to let any weeds ripen their seeds. In this, as in most matters, an ounce of prevention is better than a pound of cure.-Fessenden.
