Latest returns look favorable to Bell in Virginia, and to Douglas in Missouri.

Keating Tp. in this county, polled 6 votes, but they were all O. K. Four districts gave Fusion maj. of from 2 to 6 each, and 22 other districts gave Lincoln maj. ranging between 4 and 185.

If "mistakes were haystacks," Senator Bigler's constituents would have plenty of fodder.
