REQUISITION OF THE PRESIDENT UPON THE STATES
FOR MILITARY.

Freedom, national; Slavery, sectional! PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, the laws of the United States have been for some time past, and are now opposed, and the execution thereof obstructed, in the States of South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama, Florida, Mississippi, Louisiana, and Texas, by combinations too powerful to be suppressed by the ordinary course of judicial proceedings, or by the powers vested in the marshals by

Now, therefore, I, ABRAHAM LINCOLN. President of the United States, in virtue of the power in me vested by the Constitution and the laws, have thought fit to call forth, and hereby do call forth, the militia of the several States of the Union to the aggregate number of seventy-five thousand, in order to suppress the said combinations and cause the laws to be duly executed.

The details for this object will be issued through the War Department: of the popular government, and to redress the wrongs already long enough endured.

I deem it proper to say that the first service assigned to the forces hereby called forth will probably be to repossess the forts, places and property which have been seized from the most care will be observed, consistavoid any devestation, any destruction officer and man. of property, or any disturbance of

And I hereby command the persons composing the combinations aforesaid. who is not in physical strength and vigor. to disperse and retire peaceably to their respective abodes within twenty

days from this date. Deeming that the present condition of public offairs presents an extraordinary occasion, I do hereby, in virtue of the power in me vested by the Constitution, convene both Houses of Congress.
