## From a Penn'a Man down in Dixle. Correspondence of the Star & Chronicle. NASHVILLE, Tenn., May 5.

I have no time to tell you of the sights seen, and the experience of three months, smong the Rebels of Tennessee Safice for the present, that the Union cause is progressing rapidly. The stringent War Order-that all persons of Secesh problivities must take the Oath, be paroled and give bonds, or leave for down below-has wrought a mighty change in public sentiment here. Some take the oath of allegience, and that is called "Iren clads;" others the paroled, which is termed "Copperbottomed ;" but scarcely one will go to Dixie.
