SALTING BEEF .- The following is said to be a superior article for curing beef for winter use :

First, rub salt into it and let it remain for twenty-four hours to draw off the blood ; then take it up, let it drain and pack as desired, having ready a pickle prepared as follows: For every one hun-dred lbs. of beef, use seven lbs. salt, one onnee saitpetre, one onnee Cayenne pepper, one quart molasses, and eight gallons water ; put these all together, boil and skim and let it cool; then pour it on your beef. It is supposed this amount of water will make brine enough to cover the beef.


