Of Interest to Soldiers.

Be in enseted &c. That articles of elething, being manufactured of wool, cotton, or linen, and comprised in a package not exceeding two pounds in weight, addressed to any non-commissioned officer or private serving in the armies of the United States, may be transmitted in the mails of the United States at the rate of eight cents, to be in all cases prepaid, for every four ounces, or any fraction thereof, subjeet to such regulations as the Postmaster General may prescribe. Approved Jan. 22, 1864.

POST OFFICE DEPARTMENT, Jan. 25, 1864.—The foregoing law is published for the information of the public, and especially for the guidance of postmasters, and is thought to be so full and plain that no one can mistake its meaning Postmasters will, however, bear in mind that packages of clothing entitled to pass in the mails, four ounces for eight cents, must be manufactured from wool, cotton, or linen, and not exceeding two pounds in weight, must be addressed to a non-commissioned officer or private serving in the armies of the United States. Consequently, a package addressed to a commissioned

officer, or composed of other materials then as above specified, such as boots. shoes, &c., if sent by mail, must be prepaid by stamps at letter rates, viz : three cents for every balf ounce or fraction thereof. M. BLAIR, Postmaster General.


