mark : "Made in a sick room; where the sonlight has not entered for nine years, but where God has entered, and where two sons bave bid their mother good bye as they have gone out to the war.'

On a bundle containing bandages was written : "This is a poor gift, but it is all I had; I have given my busband and my boy, and I only wish I had more to give, but I haven't."


