THE PRESIDENT SERENADED. HIS SPEECH.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 9.
At a late hour, last night, President
LINCOLN was serenaded by a club
of Pennsylvanians, headed by Capt. Thomas,
of that State. Being loudly called for,
the President appeared at a window and
spoke as follows:

FRIENDS AND FELLOW CITIZENS:
Ever before I had been informed by you
that this compliment was paid me by the
loyal citizens of Pennsylvania, friendly to
me, I had inferred that you were of that
portion of my countrymen who think that
the best interests of the nation are to be
subverted by the support of the present
Administration. I do not pretend to say
that you who think so embrace all the
patriotism and loyalty of the country, but
I do believe (and I trust without personal
interest) that the welfare of the country
does but require that such support and
endorsement be given.

I earnestly believe that the consequences
of this day's work, if it be as you
assume, and now seems probable, will be
to the lasting advantage, if not to the very
salvation of the country. I can not at
this hour say what has been the result
of the election, but, whatever it may be,
I have no desire to modify this opinion,
that all who have labored, to-day, in be-
half of the Union organization, have
wrought for the best interests of their
country and the world, not only for the
present, but for future ages.

I am thankful to God for this approval
of the people. But, while deeply grate-
ful for this mark of their confidence in
me, if I know my heart, I feel free from
any taint of personal triumph. I do not
impute the motives of any one opposed to
me. It is no pleasure to me to triumph
over any one, but I give thanks to the
Almighty for this evidence of the people's
resolution to stand by Free Government
and the rights of humanity.

Armed Traitors Arrested.
CHICAGO, Nov. 7.—Within the last
two days a number of persons have ar-
rived from the southern part of the State,
mostly from Fayette and Christian coun-
ties. It was supposed that they were
coming here to vote, but it has turned out
that they were missions of the O. A. K.
Society, and that a conspiracy is in pro-
gress for raising an insurrection on election
day, and releasing the prisoners in Camp
Douglas.

Early this morning a large number of
arrests were made. In nearly all cases,
arms were found in their possession.
Among the arrested is Col. Marmaduke,
brother of the Rebel General of that
name. He harbored a lot of bushwhackers,
and procured clothing for them. He
is said to be Grand Treasurer of the O. A.
K. Charles Walsh, doorkeeper of the
House of Representatives, was also ar-
rested. In his house were found several
men who had been engaged in casting
bullets for the use of the conspirators.

Some of those arrested are reported to
have made confession that their intention
was to fire the city to-night, and release
the prisoners in Camp Douglas. A large
quantity of arms and ammunition was
found in Walsh's house.

CHICAGO, Nov. 7.—Col. Greenfield,
