The Border States

Delaware, "Miss Delaware," which the well-remembered and famous Mary Noah had been putting into its breeches pocket, is bound to leave the Union. It is only a few days since that her stars are steadily decreasing in number.

Whether all these States can be relied upon to keep step to the music of the Union, is a question which the Government is anxious to determine. The President's call for volunteers militia, to put down unlawful combinations against the United States, will furnish a test which may almost be regarded as an "experimentum crucis" of the loyalty of the States.

At all events, it cannot be doubted that every State which responds to the call for volunteers will also elect representatives to the next Congress. It is not certain that the States of Maryland, Delaware, and Kentucky, while hesitating about furnishing soldiers to the Government.

Some of these States have been made to feel whether Congress can constitutionally or legally, in the event of the failure or refusal of the Border States, to elect representatives to the next Congress, to return representatives to the session commencing July 4th.

It is not too early to begin to think of the possibility of a "great day" for the Union. The Government is anxious to determine whether all these States can be relied upon to keep step to the music of the Union.
