A. Suggestions.

This is no time for party strife. Our Democratic friends are marching side by side with us in our noble patriotic army. They appear to be standing just as firmly as we are by our President in this day of terrible trial. They are to the cause of the country, sincerely and as willingly as the Republicans are.

What then, shall we in view of the coming election? No. Shall we give up our party organization? No. Shall we let our Democratic friends to give up theirs? No. Well, then, shall we not stand up opposing tickets to every party? By no means. Let us maintain our organization, cherish our preferences for our friends, and yet, in the spirit of brotherly love, let us unite in the cause of freedom, and bring our respective pretensions as much as we can to bear, so long as the enemy and the government require the united and cordial support of every good citizen of every party, let us have a truce.

We have our respective party organizations. Let our respective authorities to represent the two great parties get together and agree what we shall do to save the Union, and what we shall do to save the slaves. We have three thousand Republicans proposed for office, awarded to that party; then the same number of good Democratic names, for each office awarded to that party. Let the next step be the subdivision of all the names so arranged to all the voters of the country, at their respective places of holding elections, so far as possible on the first Tuesday of the month. The highest in rank shall be given to the highest in value.

Let us have a general election. Let the ticket for the members of Assembly be either printed separately, or in such a way that each voter can vote his choice among all the names. But that the Democrats may not be outvoted on that ticket, it is to be agreed that the few highest in value—(should be the number assigned to them)—shall be declared elected, even though some Republican votes are cast for other candidates.

Or we may set up our own representative friends of the Union, who would be proposed as candidates on other sites; and by having as proposed, three names for each office, it will be voted for by all the voters—a fair opportunity would be afforded to select good men.

This mechanism would be tantamount to a election, for the vote of the last Tuesday in June, for the election of the members of the House, the only object being to legitimate the election on the first Tuesday of September. The effect would be to throw whatever contest there would be among the members of each party respectively, and prevent all strife or contention between the parties as such.

We throw this out, as we have said, merely as a suggestion. If the Democrats in the countries where they are in the majority shall adopt our suggestion, we will be bound to follow it. We will, however, be most anxious to get generally adopted, but if not, then the only alternative will be to fall back upon our own party organizations as heretofore. But we fervently hope that a spiritual spirit of good will and concord will characterize the next election throughout the State.

We wish to elicit a calm and friendly discussion on this important subject. We know that many of our friends will oppose us, and we are not afraid of that. We are, however, anxious that the public mind, in this crisis, should be led to believe that the Southern rebellion has been beaten, that the Southern rebels would be successful, and when once John Bell gets a nation into his hands, he is next to impossible to get it out.

It is true that two hundred thousand are trying to arm the South, but the South has not yet resolved to wrench the rebellion in a single campaign; but no matter, we will see that they shall not be allowed to be successful, and that shall be done. If it be in the power of all to help, and help is due, it shall be done.
