The Virginia Convention at Washington, next in importance to the meetings of our gallant Unionists of Western and Central Virginia, now in session at Wheeling. The State is largely represented—nearly all of Western Virginia, and at least five counties east of the Alleghany.

We are glad to learn that the plan of establishing a Provisional Government in the State, instead of the plan of dividing it, meets with almost unanimous assent. The sword of justice has injured greatly since the last named project was entertained. This Provisional Government will take the place of the old disloyal government, of which the openly avowed traitors in the head. Two loyal United States Senators will be chosen in place of Mason and Hunter, both of whom have forfeited their seats both for their lives. Representatives to Congress will also be sent by the districts where secessionists have not reigned supreme. Oregon, at all events, will at once recognize the independence of the Union, and if it is not admitted into the nation, "to support democratic principles in that State." Thus will Virginia, after having been torn from the Union by a vast and formidable conspiracy and rebellion, be restored, not by conquest or conquest, but by the action of her own free people.

Let us not be surprised at the Union men who were captured at Alexandria, and lately released on taking the oath, paid a very heavy price for their freedom, and in direct contradiction of the principles of the land, are totally null and void. The sum that they have been able to accomplish, will be to disqualify themselves for the exercise of any lawful or constitutional power or authority. Their treasonous conduct, no less than their base conduct, will be held up to the world as a blot on the honor of the nation, and one that could hardly have been hoped for two months ago. It is the first step towards the restoration of the Union to integrity and loyalty, for now will the aspirants of that State become traitors to their country, only, but to their own State.

Let us be correctly informed. Not for one moment has Virginia left the Union; because all the acts of the secessionists being treasonable, and in direct contradiction of the principles of the land, are totally null and void. The sum that they have been able to accomplish, will be to disqualify themselves for the exercise of any lawful or constitutional power or authority. Their treasonous conduct, no less than their base conduct, will be held up to the world as a blot on the honor of the nation, and one that could hardly have been hoped for two months ago.
