RELIGIOUS INTELLIGENCE.

The First Church of the Reformed Protestant Dutch Church commenced its sessions at Brooklyn, N. Y., on Wednesday last. Rev. Mr. C. P. GRAYSON, presiding, who conducted the services on the evening of the first day. From various reports received we gather some interesting facts. The widow's mite amounts to \$17,000.00. Receipts for educational purposes \$3,000.00. Number of students in the various classes under the direction of Dr. Grayson, one hundred. The Board of Foreign Missions sent the reported sum of \$1,000.00 to India, and one to Japan. From the report of the Board of Domestic Missions there are sixty-four missionaries and auxiliary pastors; and sixty-three missions and fields churches have been aided or wholly sustained during a part or the whole of the year. Thirty-three in the Synod of New York, eighteen in that of Albany, and eight each in that of Chicago. During the year 1855 sixteen have been received into the mission churches on condition of faith and by certificate of baptism. The board sent for \$24,000.00 to carry on the work for the ensuing year, and removed the difficulties of the Society.

A new church was presented at the meeting of the Hessian Friends in New York, by the speaker on the subject of "The Slave and the Slave," which showed how absurd it is to suppose that they would sell them right out of the master, as Peter did, when he sold out of the ear of the high priest's slave.

"Parson Brownlow," editor of a Union paper in Tennessee and a man of some note in the South, is a Methodist Local Preacher, and was formerly a traveling preacher. He was a delegate to the M. E. General Conference of 1852, which sat at Philadelphia.

The tenth annual meeting of the Conference of Western Unionists concluded last Monday at Madison. The conference is held every Wednesday in the month of June.

Rev. Dr. McMillan, pastor of the American Chapel in Paris, is taking an active part in the movements of the American residents in France. He has told our government to withdraw the rebellion of the South. Recently he had prepared for circulation in England and France the famous speech of Alexander Hales, at Saratoga, with an affidavit that the latter is not for freedom, for strange to say the English and French doubt that such monstrous doctrines were uttered in Christian America.

The Congregational Association of Illinois recently held at Galena a series of meetings on the State of the country. We give you as a sample to show the loyalty of the Unionists.

"...that this rebellion is not only treason against the United States government, but a revolt against the divine scheme for the world's advance in civilization and religion, to which the slaves are the chief instrument; that it is of infinite importance; and is therefore a high crime against universal humanity, and an impious defiance of Divine Providence."

A. That the Unionists have failed.

The cause of liberty was intended to preserve and favor freedom, and limit and dismember slavery; that the Union constituted the several States one nation, with supreme power over all, and that the Union is the cornerstone of the Federal Constitution; and that the secession of any state can only be revolution in nature, while the present position of slaves is the most important of all.

At the recent annual meeting—thirty-third of the American Peace Society, held at Boston, the discussion of the members brought out some interesting points relative to their position this war time. In the annual report the directors say that they stand in an unexpected position—face to face with a rebellion, and the question came up for solution what course shall be pursued? The answer is, under the peace system such evils could never occur. They would have every power given by the government to make it consistent with their principles. It is not for the safety of the slaves, but will be done with a view to the safety of the Union, and to secure the safety of the government.

The Southern Methodist, Missionary and Publishing interests, according to a recent statement in their official organ at Nashville, Tenn., are most embarrassed for want of funds. The statement declares "there is a deficiency in the missionary treasury of over \$70,000 to meet drafts already drawn, and the same authority reports the publishing interests not in a prosperous condition."

The New York Christian Association has taken steps to supply the spiritual wants of the volunteers soldiers. They propose to publish a monthly paper, "Christianity, the Word and the Spirit," and religious music, to be read, and distributed gratis to those who have no money to pay for it. They are also engaged in a campaign to collect \$100,000 for the benefit of the soldiers.
