PUBLICAN COUNTY CONVENTION.

The Republican electors of Allegheny county, and others in favor of the party of the NATIONAL UNION, and maintaining the NATIONAL GOVERNMENT, met at the hall of their party, Ward's Boulevarde and Turnpike at their usual place of holding meetings for public meetings on SATURDAY, the 26th instant, to elect **DELEGATES**—two to each district, and two to the national convention.

TUESDAY, September 1st, at 10 o'clock a.m., at Leetsburg.

The JUDICIAL CONVENTION to assemble at the City Hall to nominate a President Judge of Common Pleas, and the judges of Circuit Court, and other first members of the House of Representatives, and Director of the Post Office, to the Political Convocation, and to the Convocation of the Commonwealth.

The primary meetings of the two conventions will jointly open at the same time.

Tickets for the Primary Meetings.

The election of delegates on Saturday next, in the cities and boroughs, is to be by ballot.

The tickets should be headed "JUDICIAL CONVENTION" and "POLITICAL CONVENTION," respectively, in order to distinguish the two sets properly.

The call of the County Committee designates the two conventions by these names.

The Primary Meetings on Saturday next.

Let the people look to it; therefore, and send their very best men to that Convention—men who are pledged and who will employ a sound discretion in the selection of the best candidates.

We have heard it said that the parties interested in the repeal of the County Con-

troller law passed last winter, have boasted

that they "paid" that convention, and that it will nominate no man for the Legislature who is not pledged to the repeal of that law.

Can we scarcely believe that such a boast has been made; but if it has been

it behoves the people to be all the more alert

and talk the scheme, should any such exist.

The people will not tolerate, we know, any attempt to "pay" the Convention, for any purpose whatever. They were an unbiased Convention, fully aware of its responsibilities, and to the way to secure such a result is to give their personal attention to the meetings on Saturday next.
