The Late Victory in Missouri.

Our telegraphic reports, to afford some of the particulars of the Union victory obtained on Tuesday last at Fredericktown, Missouri, which was announced in yesterday's Intelligence.

The combined forces then advanced in pursuit of the Confederates, estimated at five or six thousand men, in command of Jeff. Thompson and Col. Lowe, who had left Fredericktown twenty-four hours before, and were expected to be rapidly re-arranging.

The Union loss is reported five killed, five mortally wounded, and twenty slightly wounded. The enemy's loss is not ascertained, but is supposed to have been larger.

Jeff. Thompson got information of our movements by capturing a messenger from the rebels, and he immediately sent a message to Col. Lowe, who was at the head of his column.

It is stated by the St. Louis Democrat that since the rebellion broke out in Missouri, over three hundred negroes have been murdered in other words, murdered in cold blood.
