THE REBELS AT WILSON'S CREEK!

A Great Battle Imminent!

GEN. HUNTER'S ORDER.

REEDSBURG, Nov. 4.—It would be difficult to exaggerate the gloom which pervaded our camp yesterday, and nothing but Gen. Fremont's urgent endeavors precluded it from ripening into general mutiny. His quarters were thronged with officers all day, expressing their indignation, and the inclination to resign. The Germans were there as usual, and talked of their return to Europe. I have committed grave, and I really believe irreparable, offenses. I have refused to make any statement to the Government of the United States; I have refused to publish to the world false and exaggerated accounts of the several battles fought between the contending armies; I have refused to publish any full and fair version of the origin of the war, and of the breaking up of the best Government the world ever knew; and all this I will continue to do, so long as my life, my strength, and my means permit me to do them.

The real object of my arrest, and contemplated imprisonment, is, to dry up supplies, to impede and destroy, the last and only hope of safety in a eleven needed States, and thereby to keep the people of East Tennessee, who are daily transpiring in the country.

After the Hon. Jeff Davis had visited Richmond, in a conversation relative to my paper, that he would not live in the city, that he did not tolerate freedom of the press after the judges, attorneys, jurors, and all others filling positions of trust, had signed the "Permanent Constitution," which was to supersede the Framers of the Constitution; and after the entire South had come down in their thunder upon the Federal Government, for suspending the Louisville Courier, the New York Daily Book, and other Southern journals—*the right of the most perfect liberty to be allowed to every man*, whose errors could be combated by the entire Southern press! It is not enough that my paper had been denied a place in the ordinary channels of conveyance in the country, but it must be condemned altogether, as a fit instrument to report to every man, his errors, and Gen. Hunter's direction which he has given, that the troops will be up.

Hannibal's Western Department.

Order No. 1.—The command of Major General Hunter having been relinquished by Major General Fremont, and the command of the department having been assumed by Major General McClellan, orders are issued to all brigadier commanders, and to all subordinate commanders, to report immediately to this head-quarters.
