THE SUPERMY COURT.

Judge Trumbull will shortly introduce a bill reorganizing the Supreme Court on the basis of population. It provides that for the New England States, New York and Pannsylvania, embracing ten millions people, three Judges, Clifford, Nelson and Grier shall remain. For the Southern States, excepting Kentucky and Missouri, embracing ten millions, three Judges, Taney, Wayneand Catron, shall continue to sit; while for the Vestern States, including Kentucky and Missouri, with a popoulation of ten and a half millions, three lew Judges shall be appointed, Kentucky and Ohio to constitute one circuit; Illindia, Indiana and Michigan, another; Wisponsin, Minnesota, Towe, Missouri and Kansas, a third. The Pacific States to be, as hitherto, under an independent Circuit Judge.
