The three classes of reserve comprise eight line-of-battle ships, six frigates, five corvettes and twelve sloops, mounting agrand total of 1,601 guns. The steam gunboats attached are not included, which are 21 in number, with 42 guns. This, however, does not include the gunboats and mortar vessels laid up. The list is confined entirely to effective vessels at present, or could be rendered so with little delay. The ships in commission for service at Portsmouth mount 34.2 guns. The total number of guns in the ships enumerated before is 225, while Admiral Milnes' fleet, on the North American station, amounts to \$73 guns.
