Disloyalty a Plea for Divorcement—Bingler's Case.

A curious divorce case was noted upon by the local Judiciary Committee of the House of Representatives, last week. It seems that on February 18, 1860, Miss Estlin, then the wife of a well known doctor of Philadelphia, was united to George Henry Hopkins, of Winchester, Virginia. The marriage was consummated, and the relation of husband and wife existed for some time, but Hopkins treated her with marked cruelty, indifference and cruelty. He finally forsook her in February last, and has since, it is believed, made allegiance to the Confederate Government. Miss Estlin, on the 23rd of April, 1861, filed a bill in equity, praying for a divorce from her husband on the ground of his disloyalty, and she asked for a full and final divorce. She is corroborated, as to the disloyalty of Hopkins, by Chief L. O. Baley, of the Government detective police.

The petition of Mrs. Hopkins is explicit as to details, and narrates many incompetencies of disposition and sentiment. She says, for example, that "on the 23rd of December, 1860, we had a discussion upon the speech of Howell Cobb of Georgia, who by his violent and unbecoming words, with such violence as to cause me great pain and illness. He seemed to me to be a man of a different nature and one of a different class from my father-in-law, and I was greatly shocked and distressed by his conduct." She also states that she has been repeatedly insulted and abused by her husband, and that she has been kept in a state of domestic slavery.
