A Glorious Victory.

Friday, April 11, will be a bright day in our history. On that day was achieved the glorious and bloodless victory, by the Representatives of the people in Congress, over the Gen. of slavery, which has so long held possession of the Capital of our Nation. Freedom has achieved its greatest triumph in the Hall of the Representatives at Washington. There was no din of artillery, no sharp crack of rifle, no roar of musketry, no shriek, groan and blood, which, on the distant Tennessee, made Sunday a day of gloom and foreboding. But the victory was more important, greater and grander. The one defeated a rebel army, and probably broke the neck of the rebellion in the West. The other gave a mighty and fatal blow to that system which originated the rebellion, which lies at the foundation of all our troubles, which is guilty of all the crimes and woes, and expense of this horrid rebellion. When that vote was taken, and more than two-thirds of the Representatives of the People said that slavery should no longer pollute the Capital of the Nation, a stigma was fixed upon it which it can never shake off. It has been a day of glory, instead of the exception, as heretofore, and slavery must do a leaping, if it escape a violent death.

From Nashville.

One of our friends, a merchant of the city, just returned from Nashville, Tenn., called on us Saturday. He says that Scotch, though no longer rampant in Nashville, (thanks to the restraining influence of present circumstances, of the new military Governor especially, and perhaps still more especially of the military force which attends to his bidding) is still there, and waiting for a turn of the wheel of fortune to bring them up again. All that week they were hugging the hope that General Beauregard was organizing victory at Corinth, and on Monday, when the first intelligence of the great battle at Pittsburg as it stood on Sunday evening, he was directed to the city, they could hardly keep their heads down. The Scotch continued and grew stronger till the next evening, when the terrible news of their defeat came in—a stunning, crushing reverse of all their fond anticipations. They could not believe such a disaster, and it seemed as if the first taste sickened them,—and the news ceased of course to the news from Island No. 10; they refused all credence to the story of Pope and Foote's crooning success in capturing 6,000 rebels, and an immense amount of military stores, besides an artillery, gunboats, transports and that unique specimen of the genius of Hollins, of "peppering" celebrity—the nondescript turban, now in conical mud. By this time, however, the Nashville Scotch have had the benefit of better testimony in reference to both Corinth and Island No. 10, and with Aard Fack starting them in the face, both at home and abroad, they will probably conclude that the presence and power of the Yankee, all over this broad State, must be acknowledged as inevitable, whether, as of old, showing his excellence in the arts of peace, or, as now, achieving equally distinguished excellence in the art of war—all former pretensions of the slave-holding chivalry to the contrary notwithstanding.

The Battle at Pittsburg Landing.

The details of this battle, by an eye-witness, which we give to-day, show the terrible severity of the contest, and if we may credit the account of the Cincinnati Gazette's correspondent, it was not so much a victory gained, as an enemy repulsed. The enemy attacked us, and fought desperately—our men fell back, and lost their camp, and the fighting then the enemy retired in some haste, but apparently in pretty good order. It does not appear, from last accounts, that Corinth is yet taken, or that we have advanced much beyond the field of battle. We took no prisoners, while we lost as prisoners two thousand—on account our army four thousand—officers and men. Our army was saved by desperate exertions, and after a heavy loss, and the consequences of a skillful and well executed, and most vigorous attack.

Rebel Vandalism.

Complete Success at Island No. 10.

Commodore Foote's report shows how complete was his success in capturing everything on the Island and the main land, except the rebel army, which had escaped only to fall into the hands of Gen. Pope, who had crossed the river. General Pope in his official report says:

As soon as we commenced to cross the enemy began to evacuate Island No. 10, and his batteries along the shore. The divisions were pushed forward to Tiptonville as fast as they could, Pope's leading. The enemy was driven before us, and although they made several attempts to form in line of battle and make a stand, Pope did not once deploy his columns. The rebels were pushed all vigorously, until at 4 o'clock, a. m., he was driven back upon the swamps and forced to surrender. Three Generals, seven Colonels, seven battalions of infantry, five companies of artillery, over one hundred heavy siege guns, twenty-four pieces of artillery, and an immense quantity of ammunition and supplies, several thousand stand of arms, a great number of tents, horses, wagons, etc., etc., have fallen into our hands.
