Our National Defences--Important Report from the House Military Committee--Iron-Clad Forts and Vessels the New Policy.

Judging from the ability of our unarmored ships to destroy the fine granite forts of the Chinese, it seems unlikely that any considerable number of our fortifications could long resist the concentrated fire of many fifteen-inch guns of a fleet of heavy ships thoroughly iron-clad. If inadequate to such resistance, our nation, in all its increased strength, is measurably as defenceless as in 1816.
