Karsas City, April 22.—The through mall, with Santa Fe dates to the 12th and Fort Union to the 15th, Arrived to-day.

After the battle of Pigeon Ranche, Colonel Slough fell back to Fort Union, where a dispatch was received from Gen. Camby ordering a junction to be formed with him at Galveston Major Paul was placed in command.
