The Elm City arrived this morning from White House with about 150 sick soldiers, who, with others from here, will be sent to Baltimore to morrow.

Six boys were brought in yesterday by our cavalry. They said that the robel pickets on our left wing has advanced, and they had accidentally strayed over the lines. They are believed to have been sples, sleeping in the awamp during the day, and spying around among our pickets at night.

There is occasional skirmishing going on along the whole line of the army of the Petomac, but a general engagement is not anticipated for some days.
