Accident to Troops. Philadelphia, Pa., Sept. 9.—A serious accident occurred to a troop train on the Philadelphia, Wilmington and Baltimore Railroad this morning. A freight train became stalled on the track, and a troop train, carrying the 31st Massachusetts Cavalry, ran into it, fatally wounding several men and horses.

Warfare. Sept. 9.—Late arrivals from Helena report that the country was frequently troubled by marauding parties of Indians, who were carrying off the property of the settlers and burning the houses and barns. The military authorities are endeavoring to suppress these parties.

Health with the Indians. St. Paul, Sept. 6.—Major Finley arrived last night with dispatches from Fort Big Lake, where he has been on duty for several days. He reports that the health of the Indians is improving, and that they are beginning to return to their homes.

St. Paul, Sept. 9.—A brilliant battle occurred on the 8th inst. at Fort Snelling, where a large number of Indians were defeated. The victory was a decisive one, and it is believed that the Indians will now be driven from the region.

Advances of the Rebels—Bismarck. Washington, Sept. 9.—Persons from Rock Hill, S. C., report that the rebels have advanced to within a few miles of Bismarck. The military authorities are keeping a close watch on the situation.

Captures by the Rebels. On the 2d inst. two Dahlgren gunboats were captured by the rebels on the river. The gunboats were taken to a safe place, and the crews were treated as prisoners.

Midwestern, Md., Occupied by the Rebels—Advances Toward Hagerstown. A scout reached Hagerstown, Md., on the 8th inst. and reports that the rebels have advanced to within a few miles of the city. The military authorities are preparing for a defense.
