Napoleon and Mexico--Important Events in the Dependencies.

ABOUT THE 15th of October, the Mexican Government arrested a French banker and speculator, in the city of Mexico, named JONES, together with several others associated with him, and ordered them to be delivered up to the United States.

THE UNITED STATES took up their demands.

This apparently hard proceeding drew from the foreign representatives in Mexico a joint note of remonstrance, couched in language bold and respectful, to the name of Mr. Conover, then the last.

Mr. Conover is known that the Mexican Government places great confidence in him, we think it likely that the object of the note was to give an opportunity to that government to lay before the world copies of an important document presented to JONES.

JONES is a French banker and who served Viceroy of the Spanish Government in Paris.

He was a member of the Spanish Consulate.
