The Situation in West Virginia. The rebels have finally dispersed from Morgantown and vicinity, and the valley route is believed to be a considerable distance south of the line of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad.

The two open bridges over Buffalo creek, about half a mile east of Barrenville, in the county of Boone, were completed on Monday evening at 6 o'clock. The trains carrying Major Johnson's men, which were expected to be ready by last evening, were delayed by the repair of the bridges on the line.

The building of the bridge over the Monocacy will take more time than all other work, but the work is already going bravely on. It will have to be three miles long, and will be a fine specimen of engineering.
