LAWS OF THE UNITED STATES,
Passed at the Third Session of the Thirty-
seventh Congress.

[PUNIC--No. 20.]

An Act making appropriations for the
service of the Post Office Department dur-
ing the fiscal year ending the thirteenth
of June, eighteen hundred and sixty-
four.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of
Representatives of the United States of Amer-
ica in Congress assembled, That the following
sums be and are hereby appropriated for the
use and service of the Post Office
Department for the year ending the thirteenth
of June, eighteen hundred and sixty-four:
For salaries of officers, two thousand
dollars;

For transportation of the mails (inland),
seven million two hundred and one thousand
dollars;

For foreign mail transportation, four
hundred and twenty thousand dollars;

For postage, four hundred and forty-five
thousand dollars;

For compensation to postmasters, two
million four hundred and thirty thousand
dollars;

For clerks for post offices, nine hundred
and fifty thousand dollars;

For payments to letter-carriers, one hun-
dred and eighty thousand dollars;

For compensation to telegraph agents,
eight thousand dollars;

For compensation to telegraph companies,
six thousand dollars;

For wrapping paper, forty thousand dol-
lars;

For office advertising, fifty five thousand dol-
lars;

For postage stamps and stamped enve-
lopes, one hundred thousand dollars;

For compensation to telegraph agents,
seventy five thousand dollars;

For mail bags (bags) sixty-five thousand
dollars;

For small tools, keys, and miscellaneous
household articles, one thousand dollars;

For payment of balance due to foreign
countries, two hundred and ten thousand
dollars;

For miscellaneous payments, one hun-
dred and fifty-five thousand dollars, of which
not exceeding four thousand dollars
may be appropriated for fitting up a
post office in the custom house at Newport,
Rhode Island; New Bedford, Massa-
chusetts, for the use of the post Office in
said cities.

Section 2. And be it further enacted, That
the sum of one thousand dollars is hereby
appropriated, out of any amount in the
Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the
service of the California central route.

Section 3. And be it further enacted, That
in case of any deficiency in the appropriation
for the service of the Post Office De-
partment are insufficient, that the un-
appropriated part of any act or the under-
balance of appropriations heretofore made
to meet deficiencies of that department
are hereby made applicable to the payment
thereof.

Section 4. And be it further enacted, That
the sum of one thousand dollars be trans-
ferred from the sum appropriated for the
purchase of guns and ammunition for the
Upper Plateau, to the amount of one hun-
dred and sixty-two, entitled "An act
making appropriations for the legislative,
executive, and judicial expenses of
the District of Columbia for the year
ending June, eighteen hundred and sixty-
four."

It is enacted by the Senate and House of
Representatives of the United States of Amer-
ica in Congress assembled, That it is directed
to the subsistence department of the
army, one brigadier general to be selected
from the regular army, one colonel, one
lieutenant colonel, and two majors, who
shall be commissary general of subsistence,
and by regular promotion one colonel, one
lieutenant colonel, and two majors, who
shall be commissary general of subsistence,
and that vacancies in the above-mentioned
grades shall be filled by regular promotion in
said department. And the vacancies
thus created in the subsistence department
shall be filled by selection from the officers
of the regular or volunteer force.
