ALL THE REBEL REDUBTS CAPTURED.

The Fighting Still Going on Farther Monday.

Carzo, May 22.—The steamer Imperial arrived at Memphis from below on Monday morning.

From Capt. Stevens, a passenger, we learn the following:

The fight at Vicksburg, on Friday, was desperate.

Gen. Grant changed the fortifications and took some of them, but the rebels rallied and took them. There was much hand to hand fighting.

Capt. Stevens says our loss on that day in killed and wounded was about 5,000.

The rebels were hand to hand with our forces attempting to storm the works, and were repulsed.

It is reported that one of Gen. Grant's Corps had arrived at Warren to reinforce Gen. Grant.

Carzo, May 23.—The time has passed for the rebels to make any further attempt to retake the city.
