There is hardly so much activity in commercial affairs this week as we last reported. This is caused in a great degree by the uncertainty which the House of Commons have resolved to consider and readjust. Importers of goods appear to have lost confidence, and, therefore, supply the market more freely with most descriptions of produce, whist on the other hand buyers manifest increased caution and less inclination to do business. In consequence of the prevalence of this feeling the transactions in produce have been on a limited scale, and less than for some weeks past.
