called in, would have taken the prisoners and hung them up in front of the Court Room.

After a hearing, and the commitment being placed in the hands of the Sheriff, that officer fearing that an attempt would be made to get possession of the culprits, had them conveyed out of a back window to the jail.

The Sheriff's success in lodging them safely in jail, and the disappointment of the mob, who were in front of the Court Room, only exasperated them to madness. They repaired to the front of the jail, where they commenced demolishing the walls, and would have succeded in breaking in and securing the frightened culprits, but the officers seeing the probability of their success, fired upon the mobifiled four, and wounded three. This still produced greater excitement. The persons attending the Irish meeting in another part of the city, heard of the riot, rushed to the scene of excitement, and manifested a resolution to pull down the jail.
