SENATE—The Senate called to order and proceeded to the consideration of the morning business.

Mr. Hoar, of Illinois, from the Committee on Public Lands, reported a bill granting lands to construct a Railroad from the Mississippi to the Lakes through the State of Illinois, which was ordered to be printed.

The resolution offered in the Senate yesterday by Mr. Miller, of N. J., in reference to the correspondence regarding the purchase of Cuba was taken up and debated, after which it was laid over.

Mr. Benton, of Mo., called up the Panama Rail Road Bill, upon which a debate sprung up, in which the participants were Messrs. Benton, Sherman, Foot and Allen, and before anything had been done it was laid over.
