The enormous proportion of taxes under the present system, assessed upon property in this city, to be expended in viewing and payment of damages incurred in laying out and building bridges. &c., in the opinion of your Committee, require the adoption of some other, by which the city may be relieved from a furden so unjust and onerous. Your Committee also deem it proper, in connection with this subject, to refer Councils to the act of assembly passed the 15th day of March, 1817, relating to the assessment of damages occasioned by the opening of streets and alleys in Pittsburgh, which in its operation is most unjust; and calls loudly for its repeal.

Your Committee urge upon Councils immediate and prompt action, in petitioning the Legislature, for the immediate repeal of said act of Assembly, which in its operation, cuts off the only means by which our city could receive even a partial resummeration for the enormous proportion of taxes paid into the county treasury.
