LAWRENCE, March 2, 1849.

SIR—Mr. Butler reported a bill relative to holding a Grand Court in Kentucky which was passed.

The bill requiring the states upon appeal to review the great fire at New York occupied the entire time of the session. It was discussed at length, and finally laid on the table.

The Naval Appropriation Bill was passed yesterday, appropriating twenty thousand dollars for repairing Fort Gibson in Arkansas.

HONORABLE—The morning session was occupied in the discussion of the payment of claims due to the United States by Mexico previous to the war in which Mr. Davis, Smith of Connecticut, Stanton, Collier, Evans of Maryland, and J. R. Livermore participated—all in favor of payment. The debate was not concluded when the House adjourned.
