LATE FROM SAN FRANCISCO

Philadelphia, July 21

One day later intelligence has been received from San Francisco. It contains the following extract:

"At the moment, my yet, matters remain pretty quiet, but some excitement has been going on."

"The serious disturbances among our countrymen and the Mexicans, as some six thousand of the latter have arrived in the country, and evicted a number of our citizens. You may rest assured, however, that should a serious outbreak take place, they will be shut out to a man."

FROM VENEZUELA

Philadelphia, July 21

Letters from Venezuela, under date of July 5, state that Juan Guzman has been arrested by the police of the city of Caracas.

On the 24th of June a body of horsemen attacked the residence of Monagas, but retired after a few shots had been fired. At the same time a number of people rose against the Government, in different parts of the State.

Civil war has again broken out. Monagas has assumed extraordinary power, and has arrested a number of his rivals. Prosecutions of all kinds are the result of his despotic rule. He has ordered the execution of many of his opponents, and means, or threats of means, of the Government has full power, and is raising funds by forced loans. Much trouble, consequently, is anticipated.

HORRIBLE ATTEMPT AT PARACIDIA

New York, July 21

Agnes Rathbone, aged thirteen at 57 Street, Proprietress of Rathbone's Hotel, in this city, while in a fit of delirium tremens, yesterday morning, attacked her mother with a razor, cutting her throat from ear to ear—having first attempted to cut her own throat. Pain bands are extended of her recovery.

The wretched son has been confined in a Lunatic Asylum.

RAIL ROAD ACCIDENT

Philadelphia, July 21

The Baltimore train on the track on Sunday night last, near Wilmington, killing Mr. Wm. Sparks, engineer, and as is supposed, mortally wounding a woman. The passengers escaped unhurt.

CHOLERA IN NEW YORK

New York, July 21

During the 24 hours ending July 20, there were 95 cases of cholera, and 38 deaths.

CHOLERA IN PHILADELPHIA

Philadelphia, July 21

There were 18 deaths from cholera in this city, during the 24 hours ending at noon today.

CHOLERA IN CINCINNATI

Cincinnati, July 21

For the 24 hours ending noon today, there were 21 interments from cholera, and 30 from other diseases.

Business is gradually reviving, as the cholera dies. The weather is showery.

NEW YORK MARKET

July 21

Flour—The market is very firm. Sales to-day 4,000 bushels. Good Western at \$4.75 to \$4.90 per bushel. Sales of prime Green at \$5 per bushel. Wheat—Sales of 3,000 bushels. Ohio Wheat at 110 cents per bushel.

Corn—The market is firm, and supplies are falling. Sales of 20,000 bushels. Yellow at 57 cents per bushel. Mixed Western, and 51 cents for fair. Provisions continue quiet. Sales of 100 bushels of No. 1 Yellow at 10 1/2 to 11 cents per bushel. Whiskey—Sales at 44 cents per gallon.

From the Pittsburgh Christian Advocate

We copy into our paper this week an account of one of the most shocking transactions on record. Had we been told, before it took place, that such a scene could be enacted in a civilized and supposedly Christian country, we would scarcely have believed it. Human nature, and an average, is an exceedingly perverted and depraved thing; but a conspiracy by which thousands of dollars' worth of property is wantonly destroyed—man, and women, and children, including widows and orphans, turned out homeless upon the streets and commons, while savage shouts of satisfaction and triumph at their misdeeds, and the persons prevented from working to extricate the flames—fire companies threatened with death and destruction if they attempted to do their duty, and citizens interfered with in attempting to save their own homes; all this, and much more of the same kind, as your most ardent friends of the cause of humanity, and of all that is noble and grand in human nature, have no words to express our horror of such wickedness; and it is with shame and mortification that we are compelled to record them as taking place in the city of our own residence. Our only consolation in the matter is, that this present evil great as it may be, has the consolation of a greater future good. A reform has long and loudly been called for in the "fire department." The fire companies, constituted as they have been, and composed chiefly of reckless, irresponsible young men and boys, their engine houses the scenes of corruption, rowdiness and vice, and the wantonness of their conduct in various ways has long been a source of indignation. It was born with upon the part of the citizens with suppressed murmurs of dissatisfaction, with occasional complaints, and with great anxiety for the result; but without hopes that something better would be accomplished. The events of Monday, the 16th, has awakened up every friend of law and order, and determined that a reform of such magnitude as to change the character and organization on a different basis has already been commenced. Citizens of the first rank have organized themselves as members of fire companies, and all are resolved no longer to permit of the most important interests of the city into hands which have proved themselves utterly unfit for the trust reposed in them.
