WASHINGTON, Feb. 14

The Revenue Commission will be organized both House of Congress, and will soon become law.

Mr. Adams has the floor, after the unanimous passage, in an amended debate upon a bill of point of order, which the House went into consideration of the bill.

Mr. Adams returned and continued his speech, which he commenced on Tuesday last.
