Section 2. That the treasurer of Centre county shall, whenever requested so to do by the county commissioners or county auditors, answer upon oath or affirmation respecting any and every investment or disposal of the county funds, the name of every person or institution and place with whom and where he keeps the said funds, and on what terms, without criminating himself; and all benefit, profit or gain made by any investment of the county funds shall be for the use of the county: Provided, That nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent the prosecution of the treasurer of the county for any violation of the existing laws of this Commonwealth in relation to making profit on moneys received by him as treasurer, or for the misapplication of the county funds.
