Demoralization in Mexico. Everything seems to be tending rapidly toward a general smash-up of the wretched republic of Mexico. Demoralization is universal. Public and private virtue seems to have been engulfed in a common maelstrom of corruption and abuses. The present government is a compound of venality and imbecility and has placed the country on the high road to complete prostration after an unexampled epoch of anarchy and confusion Juarez and his adversaries seem to be trying to outdo each other in this work of general demoralization. While one pretends with a weak quivering hand to administer the government for the benefit of his partisan followers, the other factions are gorging themselves like famished wolves upon the vitals of the poor republic, Negrete, the rival of Juarez, takes the city of Puebla, robs and debauches it, withdraws after three days occupation, subsequently attacks a government force, defeats it, and marches toward the capital at the head of a revolutionary army. Revolutions have broken out all over the country-in Yucatan, Quiroga, Nuevo, Leon, and so on. Excitement and alarm prevail everywhere. Inoculated with the enidemic of lawlessness by the rapacity of the so-called superior classes, the common people are fast relapsing into a condition of semi-barbarism, brigandage and moral irresponsibility. The country seems to have escaped from the control of Maximilian and the French in order to precipitate its own decline and fall, and to pave the way for its final absorption by the United States. In this demoralized condition of Mexico what is the duty of our government? It is plainly, in the first place, to adopt measures to stop the spread of the existing political disorders, as we would confine the limits of a physical epidemic that threatened to enter our borders. In the next place it is to proceed to restore order and establish a stable government over this portion of the American Continent and the American race. We believe the mass of the thinking Mexicans are sick to the heart of the harrassing fueds and fights into which the country is being continually plun. sion, and is offered at rates as cheap as elseged by unscrupulous leaders of every faction who can, backed by a few cutthroats, raise forced contributions from unprotected towns and villages and maintain an unbridled career of pillage and rapine. The day has come when action must be taken on the Mexican question as it now stands, by this government, and among the very first acts of Gen. Grant's administration should be the adoption of initiatory measures to bring about a peaceful annexation of Mexico to the United States. In no event can the Mexican people be worse off than they are in their present demoralized condition, and the prospect is that they will be vastly benefitted by the annexation.
