SWEET CORN.-It [is a surprishing fact that sweet corn is not abundantly grown among farmers.1+Every farmer thinks he must raise his five or ten acres of Indian corn, every year, in order to fatten his pork, and furnish fodder fcr his stock, etc. Now, if every farmer would grow three, or five acres of sweet corn every year his crop would prove of much more value in proportion to the numbers of acres of Indian corn for feeting purposes. Last BEDSTEADS, vm al 24 119 113 115 spring I planted six acres of sweet corn for the purpose of taking it into market, green. But after the market became 'glutted,' I concluded to save the balance of my corn and cure it for feed. I cut and fed my hogs corn (in the stalks) every day and they would eat stalks and all as clean as they would green clover. I would recommend it to those that sow corn in preference to any others.

NEW PREVENTIVE OF CATTLE PLAGUE.

Chloride of copper is now extensively used in Germany against the cattle plague, or rather as preventive. The modus operandi is as follows :- Take green crystalized chloride of copper 8 gms.; spirits of wine, 2 killog., and H. H. MANDERBACH PROPRIETOR. dissolve. With this solution impregnate a pad of cotton, lay it on a plate, and set fire to it in the centre of the stable turning the animal's head towards the flame, so as to make them breathe the flames. This operation is performed morning and evening, burning one pad for every three head of cattle. At night a spirit lamp filled with the solution is lighted in the stable. To prevent accidents, the flame is surrounded with wire gauze. The liquild is also administered internally, with the addition of 15 gms. of chloraform for the above quantity. A teaspoonful of this is put in the animal's drink three times a day. As a further precaution, the litters are watered with | K the same solution.

EARLY CULTIVATION OF POTA-Toes.-Much labor may be saved by running a brush harrow over the ground just as the shoots are breaking through. This will disturb the whole surface of the ground, and is equivalent to a good boeing. A week or ten days later, go between the rows with a cultivator, and if the young shoots are eovered deeply with dirt, it will not hurt them. The early sorts will only need cultivating once or twice more, and this can be done by horsepower. Early and frequent cultivation makes cheap potatoes. - Agricul-
