Horrible Outrage by a Negro in Dooley County, Georgia.

Some days ago a dispatch to this city stated that a negro had been taken from the jail of Dooley county, Georgia, and burned by a mob. The Macon Journal of Friday, the 26th ult., gives the following account of the crime which led to so fearful a retribution.

From a letter received from Mr. S. R. Good, of Vienna, and from a conversation with Mr. Madison Jones, of this place, who reached Macon this afternoon, direct from the scene of the crimes below related, we gather the particulars of one of the most horrible affairs we have ever heard of.

On Tuesday morning last, about 8 o'clock, two little girls, aged respectively eight and twelve years, and named Martha Holland and Emma Staniel, were passing to school by a field distant from Drayton some four miles, and in which field there was a work a negro named Needham Brown aged twenty-five years. As they came close to him he leaped the fence, and seizing them in his arms commenced to kiss and fondle them, saying as he did so, that if they screamed or made the slightest resistance he would kill them.

The youngest one, Martha Holland, frightened almost to death, did scream, and he instantly seized her, drew his pocket knife from his pocket and cut her throat almost from ear to ear, severing the windpipes and arteries. The poor little thing gave one groan and fell to the ground dead.

The second then dragged the corpse a short distance and covered it with pine tops. Returning to the other girl, he gagged and bound her, and taking her to a thicket down her. During the day he returned at intervals, and attempted to add another crime to the one already committed. Toward evening he went off after a spade, with the supposed intention of first killing the bound girl, and then using the spade to bury both in one grave.

While he was absent the girl, who had been picking all day at the rope that bound her wrists, succeeded in freeing herself, and tottering to the nearest neighbor's house, told her story. The alarm was given, and instantly the neighborhood was aroused. The negro learning that they were after him, fled, and was hotly pursued. The chase pressed on, and soon a bullet brought him to a stand still. Strong arms seized him, and secretly bound he was dragged to jail, where he now lies. He has confessed the crime, and says he can only account for its perpetration by the fact that "the devil got into him."

The Superior Court for Dooley Co. will be held next Monday week, and we do not doubt that before another month rolls round he will have paid, on the gallows, the forfeit of his life.

Delighted Buffaloes—Brad Awls for Scratchers. The buffaloes found in the telegraph poles of the overland line a source of delight on the treeless prairie—the novelty of having something to scratch against. But it was expensive scratching for the telegraph company; and there, indeed, was the rub, for the big snook drew miles of wire daily. A bright idea struck somebody to send to St. Louis and Chicago for all the bradawls that could be purchased, and these were driven into the poles, with a view to woun the animal and check their rubbing propensity. Never was there a greater mistake. For the first time they came to the scratch sure of a sensation in their thick hides that thrilled them from horn to tail. They would go fifteen miles to find a bradawl. They fought huge battles around the poles containing them and the victor would proudly climb the mountainous heap of rump and hump of the fallen, and scratch himself into bliss until the bradawl broke or the pole came down. There has been no demand for bradawls from the Kansas region since the first invoice.

The Tunnel Through Mount Cen-nis. Steady progress continues to be made with the works of the great tunnel through Mount Cen. At the end of last month 9,386 meters had been completed, viz: 5,474 meters at the south end, and 5,912 at the north end. The number of meters still to be excavated is 2,835. It is stated that the character of the rock at each of the workings is now the same, and there seems to be good reason for believing that the present rate of advance, 112 meters a month, will be maintained to the end. In that case, the opening of the tunnel through its entire length may be expected to take place by the month of July, 1871, or perhaps earlier, owing to the improvements which are constantly taking place in the manner of working.
