Philadelphia, August 1.—On Saturday night fifty thousand dollars, the proceeds of the government sale, was placed in a safe in the Treasurer's office, at the United States Arsenal in this city. Yesterday morning, on opening the safe, twenty-five thousand dollars was missing. The safe apparently has not been tampered with. The building is full of night watchmen. The affair is mysterious. Several arrests were made of arsenal employees on suspicion.

The Cuban Junta have advised that General Jordan and Figueroa, with ten thousand armed insurgents, attacked General La Forre near Santiago de Cuba, routed his forces, and captured himself. The rumor that he has since been shot is untrue. The Spanish General Puella has been defeated between Nevitas and Puerto Principe.

His son, with a large portion of his command, is stated to have joined the Cuban army. A cargo of slaves has been landed at Colorado Key for Havana planters.

New York, July 31.—The steamship Alaska, from Aspinwall the 23d instant, has arrived, and has \$85,000 in treasure from California.

The smallpox has broken out in Valparaiso.

The yellow fever has made its appearance in Rio Janeiro.

Over one hundred vessels are at the Guanabo quarr islands awaiting cargoes. These are the new Peruvian guano islands.

Earthquakes continue in the neighborhood of Iquique, creating much uneasiness. The volcano Isltur is again in action, emitting fire and ashes. Earthquakes are also occurring at Arequipa.

The corvette America, which was landed a mile from there by the big wave last August, is going to pieces. Her armament has been saved.

Matches are now made with sodium instead of phosphorus. It ignites as easily and is free from offensive odors.

George Peabody will be 75 years old next February.

The report that White, the lion tamer, has been devoured by his lion, at a small town in Michigan, is contradicted.

The great National Horse Fair will be held this year at Williamsport, Pa., September 7th to 10th inclusive.
