every person excepting Justices of the Peac who shall hold any office or oppointment o profit or trust under the United States or o who shall hold any office or oppointment of profit or trust under the United States or of this State, or a city or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or other-wise; who is or shall be employed under the Legislative, Executive or Judiciary De-partment of this State, or of the United States or of any incorporated district, and also, that every member of Congress, and of the State Legislature, and of the Select or Common Council of any city, or Commis-sioner of any incorporated district is by law incapable of holding or exercising at the time, the office or appointment of Judge, Inspector or Clerk of any election of this Common wealth, and that no Judge, In-spector or other officer of such election, shall be eligible to be then voted for." And the said act of Assembly, entitled "An act relating to elections of this Com-monwealth," passed July 2, 1839, further provides as follows, to wit: That the Inspectors and Judges shall meet at the respective places appointed for bolding the elections in the districts in which they may respectively belong, before 9.0. clock on the morning of the 2d Tuesday of October, and each of said Inspectors shall appoint one clerk, who shall be a qualified voter of such district. The case the person who shall have re-ceived the second highest number of votes for Inspector shall not attend on the day of election, then the person who shall have received the second highest number of votes

of election, then the person who shall have received the second highest number of votes for Judge at the next preceding election, shall act as Inspector in his place And in case the person who has received results of the last three years it is grathe highest number of votes for Inspector shall not attend, the person elected Judge shall appoint an Inspector in his place, and in case the person elected Judge shall no
