Little Feet.
In castle halls, or cottage homes
Wherever guileless childhood roams,
There is nothing half so sweet
As busy tread of little feet.

The sighing breeze, the ocean's roar,
The purring rill, the organ's power,
All stir the soul, but none so deep
As tiny tread of little feet.

When forth we go at early morn,
To meet the world and brave its scorn,
Down the garden walk so neat,
We see the prints of little feet.

At eve, when homeward we repair,
Withaching limbs and brow of care,
The voices ring out clear and sweet—
Then comes the rush of little feet.

The knives are lost, the dishes stray,
The tools are spirited away,
And when we go the lost to seek,
We take the trail of little feet.

But when the angel death hath come
And called the flow'rets from our home,
Oppressive silence reigns complete;
We miss the sound of little feet.

Then tools are safe, no dishes stray,
No doors go slamming all the day;
But O, 'twould give us pleasure sweet,
To hear again those noisy feet.

Soft night hath come; all are asleep,
Yes, all but me. I vigil keep.
Hush! hush! my heart, and cease to beat.
Was that the step of little feet?

Yes, mother, 'tis the softened tread
Of him you miss and mourn as dead,
And often in your sweetest sleep,
You'll dream of hearing little feet.

And when this pilgrimage is o'er,
And you approach that blissful shore,
The first to run your soul to greet,
Will be your darling's little feet.

The highest thing that has taken place, in the way of legislation for many years, in this State, has been witnessed during the past week. A bill was introduced into the Senate and rushed through both Houses within four days, which takes six millions of the Pennsylvania railroad bonds, and three and a half millions of the bonds of the Allegheny railroad, out of the sinking fund, and gives them to railroads not yet constructed, taking in lieu thereof the bonds of the different roads to be built.—The Pennsylvania railroad bonds, to the amount of six millions, go to the Jersey Shore, Pine Creek and Buffalo railroad, to construct a line from Jersey Shore, in Lycoming county, to some point in M'Kean county, to connect with the Buffalo and Washington railroad. The Allegheny Valley railroad bonds, to the amount of three and a half millions, are distributed as follows: To the Pittsburg, Virginia and Charleston company, one million six hundred thousand, to construct a railroad between South Pittsburg and Greensboro', in Green county; to the Clearfield and Buffalo company one million four hundred thousand, to construct a road from Clearfield county to M'Kean county; to the Erie and Allegheny company, five hundred thousand dollars, to construct a railroad between the city of Erie and the Atlantic and Great Western railroad. In the case of the Jersey Shore, Pine Creek and Buffalo railroad, the bonds substituted for those taken out of the sinking fund, are to be a first mortgage on the road, and in the other cases a second mortgage, with the first mortgage limited to sixteen thousand dollars per mile. It is stipulated that the road shall be completed in and running order within three years, and that the payment of the interest, at five per cent. per annum, up to the time of the completion of the roads, shall be guaranteed by the Pennsylvania, Northern Central or Reading railroad company. It is claimed that by the construction of these roads some of the richest natural resources of Pennsylvania will be developed, and that avenues of traffic will be opened that will add immensely to the wealth and prosperity of the State. By the Jersey Shore, Pine Creek and Buffalo line a communication will be opened with the important lake port of Buffalo and Philadelphia some eighty miles shorter than any existing route. It is shorter than this means a large portion of the grain trade of the west from Chicago will be directed towards Penna and the rich coal and iron fields of M'Kean, Potter, Tioga and Lycoming will receive a development that will render that section one of the richest in the State. But whether Pennsylvania, in its present financial condition, can afford to take out of the sinking fund a fund considered sacred for the payment of the public debt—bonds of roads that have a marketable value, and are at any time available, and exchange them for bonds on roads that have as yet no actual existence, is a question that at least admits of a difference of opinion.

JUST THE DIFFERENCE.—Roger B. Taney was U. S. Chief Justice for 25 years. He entered upon the duties of the office a poor man, and died leaving his family of daughters literally without a penny. Two of them are clerks, and thus earn a livelihood. Mr. Stanton left a wife and son in full health, a life insurance of \$75,000, to say nothing of \$100,000 raised by private subscription. Radical newspapers with all their clamor for economy, support a gift of \$6,000 for the Stanton family. Had it been Taney's poor daughters instead of Stanton's well-off family, they would have "died first," and such is the difference between Radical preaching and practice.

An act authorizing the appointment of commissioners to run and mark the boundary lines between the counties of Union, Centre, Mifflin and Snyder, passed the House, at Harrisburg a few days ago.

The cable from Aden, Arabia, and through the Red sea to Suez, Egypt, has been successfully laid, thus completing a direct submarine line from Bombay to Suez. The completion of the Indo-European line was announced a few days ago. This is still another route designed to be the thoroughfare of the far east. The business line will be open to the public in a day or two.

Gov. Geary has sent to the Senate the name of our distinguished townsman, Hon. Hiester Clymer, to fill one of the vacancies in the Board of Public Charities. This is a graceful compliment from the Governor to the gentleman who was his able but unsuccessful competitor for gubernatorial honors in the campaign of 1869.—Reading Dispatch.
