The Hudson River Railroad Company have just adopted the English method of giving locomotives water, a method at once novel and very efficient.

Locomotive No. 43, Ned. Sandford, engineer, was next taken from the road and put into the shop, where in a quiet manner, skillful mechanics soon fitted her out with an ingeniously formed pipe, curling from the main hole in the tender down through the latter to a position inside the hind trucks, where the pipe forms a half circle, at the end of which is the nozzle.

There are many improvements connected with it, all the handwork of Master Mechanic Buchanan. He had been at work experimenting since the 27th of May last, and has always been encouraged by Superintendent J. M. Tooney, who has been a firm believer in the plan from beginning to end.

Every movement was crowned with success, and the locomotive later in the afternoon was attached to the New York special which left Poughkeepsie at 4:15 p. m., which train proceeded direct to New York without stopping anywhere, a feat once novel and giving promise of greater deeds in the future.
