On the 9th inst., Mr. Davis of New York, the bill being up, moved to suspend the rules and strike from the bill all relating to the income tax which is so obnoxious to the entire people—Armstrong dodged the question, as he is in favor of retaining this tax, and keeping in place an array of collectors and assessors. CENTRE COUNTY NORMAL INSTITUTE—Rebersburg, Pa.—The fifth annual session will commence on Wednesday, July 27th, and continue ten weeks. The object of the School is to elevate the standard of teaching throughout the County, and prepare teachers for the every day work of the school-room. The standard of our schools must be elevated through the teachers. We cannot have good schools with poor teachers, nor are we likely to have poor schools with good teachers. The government of the school will be mild yet firm. Students unwilling to observe the rules of the Institute will not be retained. Students are expected to be present at the opening of the session, to be present daily at the religious exercises of the school, and be punctual in their attendance at the Church and Sabbath school selected by themselves or their parents.

The Literary societies—the Excelsior and the Eureka—will meet once a week. A course of Lectures by competent Lecturers will be delivered during the session.

A musical department will be connected with the Institute. All the books used can be procured at Rebersburg. The tuition will range from \$5.00 to \$10.00, one half to be paid in advance and the remainder during the term.

Boarding and furnished rooms \$2.75 per week. Students from the western part of the county, should come via Howard, on the morning train, —Tuesdays, Thursdays, or Saturdays.

On the 9th inst., the subject of Mrs. Lincoln's pension was again before the U. S. Senate. We give below the proceedings upon the matter, and call special attention to the remarks of Senator Yates, radical of Illinois, from which it would appear that there were other families, than copperheads, which were disloyal, even that of the late lamented:

On motion of Mr Sumner the bill for a pension to Mrs Lincoln was taken up—yeas, 30; nays, 21.

The bill was discussed upon the general expediency of introducing an innovation upon the pension policy of the government in providing for the widows and children of public servants.

Mr. Morrill, of Vermont, said since the death of her husband Mrs Lincoln had received \$25,000, one year's Presidential salary, and now it was proposed to vote her eight dollars per day, while the disabled soldiers of the war received only eight dollars per month. He moved to reduce the amount to five dollars per day.

Mr. Howell regarded the bill as a gross fraud. After further discussion, in which Mr. Yates charged that Mrs. Lincoln and her whole family had been in sympathy with the rebellion, which was denied by Mr. Howard, a motion to lay on the table, on which the vote was regarded as a test on the bill, was lost yeas, 24; nays, 33. The bill was then laid over informally.

The cable despatch from France, about the dangerous illness of General Robert Anderson, of Fort Sumpter fame, is almost tragical, in view of his physician's declaration for a change of climate as the means of saving his life. Gen. Anderson was broken in health, if not in heart, when he was compelled to leave New York a year ago. He was unable to pay his very moderate expenses here out of the petty income allowed him by Congress, after his retirement from the army; and he went abroad for the purpose of living as economically as possible, in some small town of Germany or France. He lost his property during the war, and though he tried hard to get some remuneration for it from Congress he failed. He was greatly discouraged by this, and also at the way in which his patriotic services at the opening of the war were slighted. Before leaving here, he offered his private library for sale, as a means of meeting the expenses of his family on their passage to Europe. There were in this library many valuable books of a military and scientific kind; for which he hoped to obtain good prices. But though his friends of the press called attention to the sale, he realized very little from it, few of the books bringing one-quarter their cost or value. He left here a poor man, shattered in constitution; and with an income so small that he had very hard work to cover the necessary expenses of his family. He has been living for some time past in a humble way, at the French town of Tours, from which we now receive the reports of his dangerous illness. It seems strange that some of the rich men of New York, who have lately raised large sums of money to keep the families of Stanton and Rawlins, after Stanton and Rawlins were dead, have not made up a patriotic fund in the name of Robert Anderson, while he is yet alive. There has been no secret about his poverty or about the insufficiency of his income, and the reasons for his going abroad have been repeatedly published in the newspapers—N. Y. Cor. Cin. Commercial.

Wool vs. Pig Tail.
Senator Trammell attempted to stem the African torrent the other day in the Senate on the naturalization question, by introducing a word for Asia, but wool kept ahead of pig-tail. He said:
I ask Senators to look at the position in which we are placing ourselves. We have now by a distinct vote placed upon this bill a provision that any person of the African race or African descent may be naturalized. We have struck the word "white" out of the naturalization law, so far as it applies to the Continent of Africa, and we have applied to the Continent of Africa, who is infinitely above the African, in intelligence, in manhood, and every respect. The amendment we have adopted is not an amendment applicable to the African living in the United States, it is an amendment authorizing people from Africa to come here and be naturalized. It opens the whole continent of Africa, where are found the most degraded examples of men that exist on the face of the earth, pagans, cannibals, men who worship beasts, who do not compare in intelligence at all with the Chinese. And I ask of Senators, are we now going to place ourselves in the condition of authorizing these Africans to be naturalized and become citizens of the United States, and deny that right to Chinamen?
