M. Paradol had prepared himself for bed, but had evidently remained up for some time in his chamber meditating suicide. He had nothing on apparently stood facing the fire place and near the centre of the room. The body was found lying on its back, with one leg drawn up and the left arm

The French Minister took possession of his house on Friday last, and on Sunday he sent his son and daughter, who accompanied him to this country, to Newport, Rhode Island, intending to join them in a few days and spend the summer. He left a note saying, "I will kill myself. M. Berthemey
