The democratic county convention will meet in the Court House, at Bellefonte, on Tuesday, 9th day of August, next, to put in nomination one candidate for Congress...

One candidate for Senator, (subject to the decision of the conferees of the 21st Senatorial district) one candidate for Assembly, one candidate for Auditor and one candidate for Jury Commissioner.

The Democratic voters of Centre county will meet at the regular places of holding borough and township elections on Saturday, the 6th day of August next, between the hours of two and four o'clock p. m., to elect delegates to appear at a convention to be held at the Court House, at Bellefonte, on Tuesday, the 9th day of August, 1870.

The Philadelphia (Leader), of Saturday, says: We take great pleasure in announcing the fact that the Supreme Court is at an end. All the railroad companies whose offices are in this city yesterday paid the half year's interest, then maturing, on all of their debts created before the passage of the legal-tender act, in coin, or its equivalent.

The amount of the Pennsylvania railroad company's second 6's is \$1,887,840, and of the Philadelphia and Erie first mortgage 6's is \$1,000,000. The interest payment on these three several items of principal, at 3 per cent, amounts to about \$328,000, the premium on which will cost some \$40,000 at the present rate of premium.

The Reading Company, and we believe, the North Pennsylvania, also paid the full interest without deducting the five per cent. Government tax. We are not of opinion that we shall ever hear anything more of the threatened attempt to procure a reversal of the widely and warmly discussed legal-tender decision.

While the action of these officers may be commended for this evidence of integrity and returning loyalty, we believe in this, as in all like cases, that honesty will be found the best policy, and that more will be realized in the shape of improved company credit than the gold cost of establishing a reputation for fair dealing.

In view of the dispatches from Europe, it is interesting to know what military force the nations concerned can put in the field. France has 414,632 soldiers on the peace footing, and 347,271 in the field, a total of nearly 1,000,000.

On the other hand, Prussia has 726,000 men on the peace or 1,266,000 on the war footing, 300,000 now ready for operation on her western frontier.

Italy, out of a force of 376,721 on a war footing, with 196,000 of a reserve, or 572,721 in all, could spare possibly 200,000 men to operate on the French frontier or hold a hostile corps in check.
