#### Very Latest.

ST. LOUIS, April 23.—The Democrats of this morning say that they have received the necessary orders yesterday and about 700 men were ordered under the President's proclamation, and received by and placed under the command of officers of the U. S. Arsenal in this city. It is understood that about 1,500 men (under their service) will be accepted. About 1,300 troops are now in the Arsenal.

PHILADELPHIA, April 23.—The mail communication with the South has been resumed. The mails are conveyed in wagons between Baltimore and Havre de Grace.

LOS ANGELES, April 23.—A private dispatch says that Cairo, Illinois, has been invested by one thousand federal troops, and four thousand men are expected soon.
