At ten o'clock on Tuesday morning the delegates elected to meet in a Union Convention, assembled in the Supreme Court room.

The following Vice Presidents were selected: Henry Ingram, of Chartiers; Abraham Gray, of East Liberty; Dr. A. H. Gross, of Peabody; Col. John Kramer, of Sawicki.

S. McIlwain, of the Sixth Ward, Pittsburgh, Geo. W. Lonsdale, of the Third Ward, E. G. Glavin, of the Second Ward, and Alfred Karr, of Birmingham, were chosen Secretaries.

On taking the chair Mr. Finney thanked the Convention for the honor conferred in selecting him to fill the distinguished position of chairman.

Mr. Finney then proceeded to read the report of the Executive Committee, which was received with applause, embracing every district of the county.

From Jefferson City.

Jefferson City, Sept. 17.—Reports are current that Lexington has been captured, but they are not believed.

Parties from Putnam county report a fight at Blackwater, in which the secessionists defeated the Home Guards and burnt Blackwater bridge.

A man named Griffin arrived here today and states that on Saturday last, Gen. Price, with 17,000 men, had surrounded Lexington, and sent a summons to Col. Mulligan to surrender.

Col. Mulligan refused, whereupon Price is reported to have sent word that he would give him until Monday at four o'clock to surrender, and if he did not that he would march on him with a black flag.

It is confidently thought in military quarters here that General Burges has by this time reached Lexington from Joseph, and Price will be cut off or forced to retreat.

Quite a panic prevailed at Georgetown on receipt of reports from Lexington, and many families fled, fearing an attack from the rebels.

St. Louis items. St. Louis, Sept. 17.—Gen. Sturgis with one regiment of Infantry, two companies of Cavalry and one of Artillery, took possession of St. Joseph on Friday last.

It is reported that a battle took place at Lexington yesterday, between the Federal forces there and Gen. Price's rebels, in which most of the latter were captured.

Another bridge was burned on the Hannibal and St. Joseph Railroad a day or two since, precipitating the locomotive into the stream, and killing the engineer.
