NEW EDITION.
BY TELEGRAPH.
The Impending Battle at Lexington.
JEFFERSON CITY, Sept. 30.—Special despatches to the St. Louis Republic state there is no intelligence of importance from Booneville, Georgetown, Sicks or Glasgow, and no apprehensions are felt of any immediate attack on any of those points by the rebels. All reports received from Lexington corroborate the opinion already expressed that the rebels intend to keep their main force there; but it is stated that several bodies, from 200 to 5,000 in number, have left there within a few days past for the north and west, but for what purpose is unknown. Gen. Fremont presumes a strict silence, but has intimated to the press that he is determined to be actively engaged in ascertaining the exact number of troops he can command, and organizing plans for the successful prosecution of the campaign, or failure of which he is to test his reputation upon and win or lose his all. Every day an increased interest is felt in the approaching battle, for it is generally supposed that it will decide the fate of Missouri. Some persons murmur at the delay; but Gen. Fremont is determined to have everything ready before he advances, and to strike a blow before he believes that his army is inferior to the rebels. The probability is that he will be successful, and that the rebels will be driven from their positions. They are stationed very near to each other, and the intelligence of their movements is conveyed to Price's headquarters in the briefest space of time. A telegraph wire was laid to Gen. Fremont's headquarters at Camp Lilly this afternoon.

APPROACHING BATTLE BETWEEN FREMONT AND PRICE.
CHICAGO, September 30.—There is much speculation here concerning the strength of the two armies about to meet at Lexington. It may be interesting to state that letters received here from Huntsville, Mo., dated the 27th, express the confident opinion that Fremont will be beaten unless he can bring 60,000 men against Price. The writer says the number is filled with arms, and men marching to reinforce Price. It is estimated that Fremont's army numbered 25,000 to Price's strength. Everything is reported quiet at the Hansbal and St. Joseph Barracks.

APPROACHING BATTLE BETWEEN FREMONT AND PRICE.
WASHINGTON, October 1.—The latest advices from Fort Pickens state that the blockade of Pensacola Bay is strictly enforced. The friends of ex-Mayor Berrett say he has gone to New York, proposing to reside there during the continuance of the present troubles. It is satisfactorily ascertained that the rebels have not lately sent any dispatches to the press (the typical Polk). They have merely retired further back into Virginia. Their lines extend from Occoquan and Massanes to Fairfax Court House, Manassas, obviously being the base of operations. Unsuccessful attempt to fire a bridge.

APPROACHING BATTLE BETWEEN FREMONT AND PRICE.
CHICAGO, Sept. 30.—A special dispatch from Cairo to the Times says that the rebels attempted to burn the bridge one mile from Norfolk, this morning, but were met and repulsed by Capt. Monaghan's cavalry. Three rebels were killed at the first volley and others killed and wounded afterwards. Only one Federal was wounded. The rebels have been repulsed as death is sure. He may as well let the truth be known. A noted secessionist arrested.

APPROACHING BATTLE BETWEEN FREMONT AND PRICE.
St. Louis, October 1.—The Republic learns that a statement is forthcoming from Colonel Handing, the Adjutant-General, Lyon, who was in the charge of Gen. Lyon, in command of this Department, up to the period of Gen.
