CITY MATTERS

Western Virginia Items
The Wheeling Intelligencer of Saturday states that on Friday Governor Pierpont received a dispatch from T. N. Davy, Adjutant General Pierpont, as follows: Large numbers of men are gathering at Petersburg, Ky. (near our line) and Union men are leaving their families and homes and concentrating at Callettsburg. Five regiments ought to be sent there immediately. We have been notified of an attack to-night by fifteen hundred cavalry. Economic affairs appear to be rampant in Bartsburg.

On Tuesday last, the rebels at Worthington, Marion county, killed a man named Sharp, a member of Captain May's Home Guards. They ran his body through with a bayonet, and lying a bullet across his breast left him lying on the ground. The next day a party of the Union soldiers came upon a body of the rebels and killed two of them, John Anderson, a ringleader, and another man, John Galantine. At another time the Union men took the hand of John Richter, as he was sneaking through the woods. The capture of Worthington was being most effectively scouted.

Some of our readers are already informed that on last Friday Governor Pierpont and Lieutenant Blayden, of Colonel Ziegler's 5th Virginia Regiment were shot near Caswellville, Virginia, by a body of concealed secessionists. Two companies of the regiment, with a small party of cavalry, the latter a half mile in advance, were returning to Camp Pierpont, after an expedition into the country. Major Olmstead, Lieutenant Blayden and others, and lines behind the cavalry, not dreaming of danger, when the rebels were fired upon and the two named killed. The bodies were taken to Callettsville, Ky., where the deceased officers were buried. The arrival of the bodies created the intense excitement in the village, which continued through the next day and until after the funeral. All of the prominent secessionists of the place were arrested, some twenty in number, and taken to Camp Pierpont, where they were held in custody. Then sent to Louisville. Lieut. Blayden's wife was almost distracted. She is said to have fallen upon the grave of her husband, to which she clung with the wildest distress. This, with other similar scenes, aroused the people to the highest pitch of excitement.
